Canada Opposes UN Draft Declaration of Indigenous Rights

The Dominion – On June 29, 2006, the United Nations Human Rights Council adopted a Draft Declaration of Indigenous Rights. The Declaration affirms the right of self-determination of Indigenous Peoples, including the right to traditional territory and resources, and the right of Indigenous Peoples to oversee their own education in their own languages. It was passed by a vote of 30-2— Russia joining Canada in opposition to the Declaration.

Ghislain Picard, regional chief of Quebec and Labrador, is frustrated that Canada is seen by so many as an international leader in human rights, while it continually undermines the rights of Indigenous People. "It is very disappointing, even frustrating, to see that the government of our own country has such a closed mind towards the protection of the rights of Indigenous Peoples," he says. "All the more so that Canada pretends to be a key player on the level of human rights internationally."

Mayans Occupy Canadian Mines in Guatemala

Reuters – Hundreds of Mayan Indian families have invaded land owned by a Canadian nickel mining firm in Guatemala, setting up makeshift camps and demanding the company cede land for subsistence farming. Skye Resources Inc. plans to reopen a long-dormant nickel project near Guatemala's Lake Izabal.... but environmental concerns and disputes over land rights prompted more than 1,000 Mayan Indians living near the site to occupy... areas in the company's concession.
