When the first Info Usurpa bulletin came out one year ago, the Mondragon's *Save the Drag* fundraising events series was getting into full swing, and the Bike Dump had recently opened its doors for the first time. The aim of Info Usurpa is to get people thinking about how we can make the best and most creative use of three particular spaces in town, and to inform folks about events already taking place in them. The name and layout were borrowed, with permission, from a weekly Catalan language bulletin about events in squats throughout the city of Barcelona.
