27 Years Ago: US and Canada Boycott Invasion of Afghanistan

This week in radical history:

- 21 March 1980 – Then-US President Jimmy Carter announces a US boycott of the 1980 Summer Olympics in Moscow to protest the Soviet invasion of Afghanistan. Canada follows suit.
- 24 March 1980 – Archbishop Oscar Romero is shot to death by members of Salvadoran death squads, including two US-run 'School of the Americas' graduates.
- 24 March 1999 – NATO begins bombing Yugoslavia. The bombing campaigns would claim the lives of 500 civilians.
- 20 March 2003 – The United States invades Iraq.
- 23 March 2006 – CPT hostages freed from the Swords of Righteousness Brigade in Iraq.
