358 Years Ago This Month: The Digger Movement Begins!

In the mid-1600s, not long after the Civil War had sent England into upheaval, a proto-anarchist group emerged called the 'True Levellers'. They spoke out against exploitation by the British ruling class and advocated organizing into self-supporting communes. They felt they should farm the land in common, be conscious of the interdependence between people and nature, and make the ruling class obsolete so that it would vanish. When they began planting vegetables in common in April of 1649 they became known as the Diggers. They issued pamphlets and manifestos, to the consternation of their feudal lord, who organized gang attacks on the Diggers, beatings, and the arson of one of the communal houses. They lost the court case they opened against him, mainly on the false grounds that they were associated with a group who advocated a liberated sexuality. Smaller groups of Diggers relocated throughout England, only to be faced with the same persecution by landowners wherever they turned. The Digger movement came to an end within a few years.
