Arsonfest 2007's Proceeds to Benefit the Grassy Narrows Blockade

Now in its 8th year, Arsonfest is Winnipeg's annual Hardcore/Metal/Punk/Grind festival. This year, it's happening at the R2C2 (see above) the proceeds are going to support the blockaders at Grassy Narrows. Friday's show is \$10 and Features Poser Disposer (saskatoon), Exit Strategy (calgary), Tugnut (ontario), I Die Screaming (calgary), Big Trouble in Little China, and Sea Wizard. Saturday is \$12 with Think Don't Pray (calgary), Mudlark, Half Gorilla, Useless Wooden Toys, Fits of Fury, Kursk, Search and Destroy, Human Garbage, and Hatred of Humanity (edmonton).

Free the San Francisco 8: Former Black Panthers in Prison Need Your Support

Eight former Black Panthers are currently in prison in California on charges related to the 1971 killing of a San Francisco police officer. Similar charges were thrown out in 1975 after it was determined that the evidence used to indict the men was extracted by police torture. Two of the men have been held as political prisoners the past thirty years in New York State prisons, but the other six have been living regular lives, working and raising families. These men, known collectively as the **San Francisco 8** (SF 8) are being held on \$3 million bail each. The men, their legal team and their supporters are trying to get it reduced so that those members of the SF8 who are not currently serving time can go home during the upcoming legal proceedings. The struggle to gain these men's freedom is gaining but will require much more public support. Like the campaign waged in 1971-1972 to free Angela Davis and the ongoing campaign to free Mumia Abu Jamal, this must become a widespread international campaign.
