Grassy Narrows Day of Action on Wednesday

The five year Grassy Narrows Indigenous logging blockade has become a critical focal point in the fight for social justice and ecological sanity. In January 2007, the Grassy Narrows First Nation called for a complete moratorium on all industrial activity on their traditional territory without community consent in order to protect their land and culture from further destruction. But companies like Grand and Toy and Office Max continue to sell paper made from trees clear-cut on Grassy Narrows territory. On January 30th, call on Grand and Toy and Office Max to publicly support the moratorium, and stop selling paper made from Grassy Narrows' forests without consent. Actions can range from a letter delivery to a store manager, to distributing flyers and petitioning, to protests with placards, street theater, and civil disobedience.

National Day of Action to Support Laibar Singh

This past weekend, eleven cities across the country, from Fredericton to Vancouver, held events to support Laibar Singh, a disabled man who the Canadian Border Services Agency (CBSA) have sought to deport to India for over a month, notably on December 10th, International Human Rights Day: "In a historic and unprecedented move, approximately 1500-2000 people including elders, women, and children converged at the Vancouver International Airport and surrounded the vehicle in which Laibar was being brought to the airport in for his scheduled deportation. Canadian Border Services Agency officers were unable to remove Laibar and were forced to postpone the deportation. The physical prevention of a deportation/expulsion- one of the most violent forms of state-sanctioned repression and brutality in the world todayhas been hailed as a significant victory and has served as a powerful inspiration to movements across North Amerika," writes Harsha Walia, of No One Is Illegal.
