Love and Rage Collective Presents a Second Afternoon of Feminist Workshops

Love and Rage Collective -- We think feminism is a valuable tool for change. But we also think that the way feminism has "evolved" is problematic...since the 1970's it's been stuck in the universities (where a privileged few learn really big words that no one else understands) and in other institutions like the government (where some women get really good jobs and benefits while others are stuck working without receiving a living wage). We don't think this is enough...we think that liberal feminism is giving us all a bad name. We want to dig up the roots of gender oppression and we think they are all tangled up with capitalism, heterosexism and white supremacy so we have a lot of work to do and would love for as many people as possible to come on out and participate in this process. We want to build a thriving community in Winnipeg where we all feel safe, welcome, and engaged.

This Sunday Jan 20th at Wolseley Family Place (691 Wolseley Ave) from 1-4pm, join us for your choice of two workshops. Feminism and parenting will be a facilitated discussion focusing on how being parents affect our lives as women, and on what it means to parent from a feminist perspective. Pink and blue (a theatre workshop) will use interactive *Theatre for Living* exercises to explore this crazy little thing called gender. Laibar Singh Safe in Sanctuary in Surrey

Adapted from a No One Is Illegal Vancouver release -- After the Canadian Border Service Agency's (CBSA) attempted violation of Laibar Singh's sanctuary at Guru Nanak Sikh Temple in Surrey on December 9th, 300 supporters arrived at the airport and prevented their attempt to carry out his deportation. He is currently safe, but the deportation order stands, and Canada has already demonstrated its willingness to breach a historic moral tradition of sanctuary, despite the recommendation of even the House of Commons Standing Committee to respect it. Organizing continues to be carried out in defense of the disabled man.
